8. PFA

The Secretary tabled a copy of a letter received from Mr Joe Corcoran in which he congratulated the SA Open team for coming second in the 2014 ISC. Adrian Clements took the medals and said he would present them to those team members present at the upcoming League round.

Should the proposed Constitution be accepted at the PFA AGM SAPL would need to redraft its constitution to comply and also seek to impose organizational requirements on affiliated clubs. This may well prove problematic as currently SAPL has no jurisdiction over the SA clubs.

That, the document titled 'Petanque Federation Australia Constitution' tabled at the meeting is adopted as the constitution of the Company in substitution for the current constitution and by-laws and it will come into effect at the close of this meeting.

All clubs that are affiliated to PFA have a vote on this and I urge SAPL affiliated clubs to express their opinion either by attending the AGM or by appointing a proxy who will vote as instructed by your club. Adrian Clements is attending and is willing to act as proxy. Proxies must be appointed and the PFA Secretary informed one week before the AGM. I have attached a copy of the proxy form to this note. PFA claim that adoption of the proposed constitution is paramount to Petanque being accepted as a sport by ASC if this is the case the announcement by the PFA secretary on the 23 January that ASC has agreed to recognize Petanque is either wrong or indicates thatthe board have negotiated the constitution with ASC before putting the document up for member approval. I assume that the latter is correct.

Adoption of the constitution would appear to mean that the current By Laws which have been used in the past to threaten SA clubs are no longer a part of the PFA management system. Instead the constitution will be supported by Policies. So far we have seen three policies all of which have been poorly constructed and self-contradictory.

There is no provision in the constitution or policies for clubs to have social members.

The proposal to adopt the constitution is likely to be passed, clubs in WA, Victoria and NSW will I think be supportive. PFA consider that SA is a difficult state, this was included in the Sports Directors report at the 2014 AGM and the report was adopted by the AGM participants. (Proposed and seconded by NSW) In the attached table I have made an assessment of the impact of the new constitution on SAPL.

The new constitution places 23 requirements on State leagues but does not allow the State leagues to vote at PFA meetings. Many of the requirements are in conflict with the current SAPL constitution and will mean changes to the way in which SAPL is run.

I think SAPL should carefully consider its position.

To agree to align our constitution with the one that PFA is proposing would preclude clubs with social members from affiliating with SAPL and hence PFA this will reduce SAPL to three clubs and mean that it will not be worth continuing.

The PFA board has demonstrated in the past that it considers it good management to cherry pick odd requirements and use these to threaten organisations it dislikes. To protect itself against this SAPL may need to impose a similar type of control over affiliated clubs as that which PFA is trying to impose on SAPL. I do not believe that SA clubs would accept this approach.

We could say yes, do nothing and fight off any demands that we find unacceptable.

If SAPL decides that it does not wish to be recognized by PFA that will mean that we will probably not be invited to participate in the ISC and SA players will not be included in the Australian team selection process.

I don't have an answer the point of this paper s to promote discussion among clubs affiliated to SAPL.

Speed Petanque 13

Hi All

In this era of speeding up our favourite sports I have designed one for Petanque, the focus is to reward quality pointing and shooting.

Some Rules

1 Games are played to 13 points or 8 ends (whatever comes first).

2 Scoring - Pointing

- -2 points if your boule finishes up to 10 cms from the coch.
- 1 point if your boule finishes up to 30 cms from the coch.

Shooting

- 1 point if you hit out the opposition boule.
- -2 points for up to a 30 cm carro.
- -3 points for a perfect carro.
- 3 All points scored during the end being played are counted even though they maybe dislodged later in the end by your opponents
- 4 Maximum time between shots is 30 seconds.

NB Its important to have a scorer to keep track of the scoring during and at the end of each end and a good measuring tape.

5 The team winning the end, ie their best boule is closer than their opposition gains a Bonus point for winning the end.

The aim of **Speed Petanque 13** is to play as many games as possible in a tournament, eg, play a 10 **round competition** the winner having the best Wins, and For/Against points.

Or play 6 preliminary games with a final series as we do now eg quarter, semi and grand final competition
